# PROJECT: FORESTS FOR SCHOOL GROUNDS, PHILIPPINES

A school in Muntinlupa, Philippines, recognised the growing concern of children distancing themselves from the outdoors. As children increasingly preferred interactions with devices, the institution decided to reevaluate device access on school grounds.

To rekindle children's love for nature, the school sought ideas, and identified a need for a new playground. TerraLupa conducted collaborative ideation workshops in April with the students to gather wishes and dreams.

The proposed approach is two-fold, through a nature-focused project: first, educating students about climate change and carbon sequestration, and second, co-designing a play space that promotes outdoor engagement through play and creativity. Creating a pocket “Miyawaki” forest is key to the plan - integrating playground elements within the proposed landscaping.

To ensure a resilient future, we must cultivate our children's imagination.
